Cell Theory Timeline

- 1. Name, period and date on the back of the paper
- 2. Draw a horizontal line across the middle of your paper. This will become your timeline.
- 3. Mark off the eight years on your line. Make sure the distance between the years makes sense (don't have 334 BC and 1595 <u>right</u> next to each other because that is a long time difference)
- 4. You need the date, the name of the scientist and what happened in that year for each of the eight dates that we talked about in your notes. The placement of the name and what happened can be above or below the line just make sure it is easy to read and is neat.
- 5. Draw a picture for each of the dates. This can be a picture of the scientist or a picture of something that the scientist did or discovered.
- 6. Color your pictures.
- 7. Somewhere on the front of your paper (in a corner, across the top, across the bottom, etc.) write out the three parts of the cell theory.
- 8. Turn it in to the basket when you have completed all the steps.

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
